Program

International epidemiological data suggests that 40% of the population will suffer from neck pain within any given year with a re-occurrence of 60% after the first episode.

Neck pain is a multifaceted disorder that requires an understanding of anatomical, biomechanical and neural structures.

Therefore this workshop will aim to educate the clinician not only in the anatomy and functional aspects, but also the various associated disorders of the cervical spine and its contribution to the head, jaw, shoulder girdle and arm pain.

Day One hands on component will focus on examination skills, posture and conservative Soft-Tissue management of the cervical spine and associated structures. This will include the jaw and chronic whiplash associated disorders.
